







November 1, 2007 to November 1, 2011






## TOTAL ANNUAL GIFTS RECEIVED








## NUMBER OF UTORmail ACCOUNTS AT YEAR END

## NUMBER OF MESSAGES DELIVERED BY UTORmail POST OFFICE


2006-2011 (In Millions)
