





November 1, 2011 to November 1, 2015















## AVERAGE NUMBER OF WIRELESS SESSIONS PER DAY




## AVERAGE NUMBER OF UNIQUE WIRELESS USERS PER DAY

2012 -15




### AVERAGE NUMBER OF UNIQUE WIRELESS DEVICES PER DAY






