







INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENROLMENT: FIVE-YEAR TREND















AVERAGE NUMBER OF UNIQUE WIRELESS USERS PER DAY 2012 to 2017




AVERAGE NUMBER OF UNIQUE WIRELESS DEVICES PER DAY

2012 to 2017



NUMBER OF PUBLICALLY ACCESSIBLE TERMINALS BY CAMPUS 2012 to 2017






